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Defining the Problem: Challenges Faced by Youth with Experience in Foster Care in Getting to College

Research indicates that while 70 percent of youth aging out of foster care desire to go to college (Courtney, Terao, & Bost, 2004), only about 20 percent of college-qualified youth from foster care enroll, compared to 60 percent of general population (Wolanin, 2005).







Academic Preparedness

 52% of students who have experienced foster care read below grade level, compared to 38% of the overall population (Lesnick, Goerge, Smithgall, & Gwynne, 2010).







School Stability

- More than one-third of foster children reported having five or more school changes during their time in care (Courtney, Terao, & Bost, 2004).
- Reducing the number of placement changes per year by one almost doubled the likelihood that foster children would graduate from high school before leaving care (Pecora et al, 2003).

Support from adults and professionals is IMPERATIVE!
