- Casey Family Programs (2006) *It's My Life* Framework
- WMU adapted framework to include education at the center
- 7 domains framework offers a way to organize, understand, and develop a response to the complexity of lived experience.

Personal identity refers to the ways in which a person feels a sense of attachment or ownership, what defines someone as a person, or what makes a person who they are

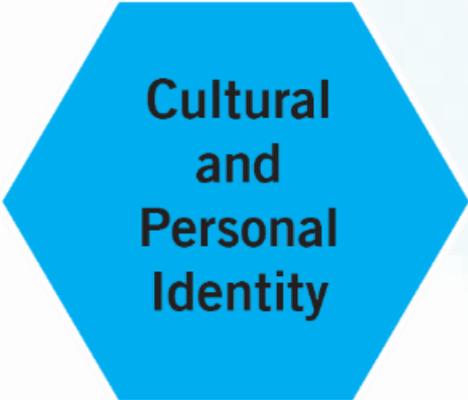

- Cultural identity is the feeling of belonging to a group that has its own distinct culture.
- Another term that is used for cultural identity can be “social identity” to describe parts of ourselves that are often named by society and connect us to a larger social identity group.
- Examples include: race, ethnicity, class, ability, religion/spirituality, age, nationality, first language, sexual orientation, biological sex assigned at birth, and gender identity/expression

- **The Center for Fostering Success takes a cultural humility approach to understanding identity**
- **We see identities as intersectional**
- **An individual's personal, social, and cultural identities are uniquely inter-connected and multi-faceted**

- Young adults who experience foster care or homelessness may have fewer opportunities to develop a sense of personal and cultural identity. This can be due to lack of family support, as young people often build identity from the traditional concept of family.
- The systems of child welfare and juvenile justice lack the adequate identity development supports of support for the young people they serve.

Building a strong, positive sense of identity can help establish:

- **Confidence**
- **Resiliency**
- **A healthy self-image**
